A LITTLE HISTORY...

The historic village of Kettering was first explored in 1792 by Bruni D'Entrecasteaux (for whom the surrounding channel is named) and is situated in a bay known as Little Oyster Cove.

Settled in the 1800s Kettering has grown around the fishing, ferry and whaling port of Little Oyster Cove.

Kettering village is only 30 minutes drive south of Hobart surrounded by wooded hills and offering stunning views of Little Oyster Cove, Bruny island and the D'Entrecasteaux Channel.

As well as being located at the gateway to Bruny Island the village offers ready access to a wide range of local attractions and is an ideal base to explore the world-renowned Huon Trail.

Heating and cooling user guide:



Your room is equipped with a reverse cycle heat pump (AC).

The remote control is in the holder near the door.


Cooling: Set to 24-27 degrees

Heating: Set 18-22 degrees

These temperatures offer the most efficient heating/cooling for your room. Extended use at higher or lower temperatures may cause damage to the unit.

Please switch off the unit when not occupying the room

Underfloor heating. Your room offers underfloor heating in your bathroom. We recommend setting to 18-22 degrees for optimal ambient temperature - note it takes some time to heat up! Controllers are located on the wall in the bathroom. There is a switch on the side of the controller to turn the heating on. Select manual and set the desired temperature.



*Room 4 has one touchscreen control on the wall to the right of the bathroom entrance.



Fireplace. You'll find our spectacular Cheminees Phillippe slow combustion firebox in our guest lounge. You are welcome to light this fire at any time. You'll find all you need to get it going is well stocked - with additional supplies in the wood box on the lounge deck. Please be careful with opening and closing the glass doors and use the tools provided at all times. Ensure you ONLY use the materials provided to light and maintain your fire.


Kettering Cafe & Restaurant


Seawall Cafe

Eat



Explore by Water

Water, water everywhere. Southern Tasmania is bristling with hidden coves and secret bays, broad channels and waterfalls, inlets and mighty rivers – and myriad ways to dive in. Paddle the rivers and bays of the far south by kayak with **Esperance Adventures**, learn about the heritage craft of wooden boat building at the **Wooden Boat Centre** in Franklin. For higher-octane adventure, take a ride with **Bruny Island Cruises** around a dramatic shoreline, punctuated by cliffs, stacks, caves and marine life.



Graze

Dawdle between farm gates, roadside stalls and markets in the Huon Valley, known for its apple and pear orchards and abundant fresh produce. There's more grazing along the D'Entrecasteaux Channel, and just a short ferry ride across to **Bruny Island** for oysters, artisanal cheese and craft beer. Explore the laidback food scene in towns such as **Geeveston, Cygnet, Franklin** and **Huonville**. And roll up the sleeves at cooking classes staged by the likes of the **Farmhouse Kitchen** and **Fat Pig Farm**.



Make your way to the Edge

It takes less than two hours to travel to **Cockle Creek**. Yet at latitude 43 degrees, buffeted by a gale fresh from Antarctica, and on the edge of the vast Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area, the sense of life-affirming isolation at the edge is complete and profound.

Approach another edge at **Tahune Airwalk**, a 600-metre canopy walk near **Geeveston** that hangs high above the forest floor, with a final cantilevered section positioned – thrillingly – 50 metres above the Huon River. And water reaches the edge of cliffs and gorges across the south; insiders recommend chasing Peverata Falls, Billy Brown Falls, Arve Falls and Adamsons Falls.

Discover Natural Wonders

The south's natural wonders are as diverse as they are numerous.

Head underground to explore the labyrinth of dolomite chambers on a tour at Hastings Caves and Thermal Springs and, above ground, walk its rainforest tracks.

Bruny Island, climb the stairs for sweeping 360-degree views from The Neck Lookout, on the isthmus joining North and South Bruny. And venture into the remote waterways of the South West Wilderness



Into the Wild

What does a 3000-year-old tree look like? And what is real wilderness? A journey to the Southern Edge is the place to think about the big questions – and a portal into one of the last great wild places on Earth, the 1.4 million-hectare Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area.

Insiders recommend the **South Cape Bay Track** In Hartz Mountains National Park, they traverse landscapes shaped by glaciers to reach Hartz Peak as a day walk. And on Bruny Island, insiders favour the beach-and-bush vistas of Cape Queen Elizabeth Track and the Fluted Cape Track.



Starry Skies

Look up – in a world where more than 80 per cent of people live with light pollution, the stars are fading, the universe shrinking. In southern Tasmania, however, the universe seems close and vast, the unpolluted night sky inky and sparkling with glittering constellations and the glorious spilt-milk mess of the Milky Way. It's the night sky as you've never seen it. Tasmania is also one of the few places in the world to see the elusive natural lightshow of Aurora Australis, or the Southern Lights. Chances improve the further south you head.

Explore

Bruny Island

Whether you are a gourmet, a history buff or lover of the outdoors, Bruny Island has a unique ability to enchant.

Bruny is the same size as Singapore, but has a population of less than 1000, rather than 4.5 million. It's a great place for beach walking, or taking a trek to the Cape Bruny Lighthouse.

It is close to 100 kilometres from Bruny Island tip to tail and can be almost deserted midweek, making it the perfect escape from city hustle with limited mobile reception, beautiful beaches (Adventure Bay has been named among the best in Australia) and dramatic scenery.

Bruny Island was first sighted by Abel Tasman in 1642 and named after Rear Admiral Bruny d'Entrecasteaux, who visited the island in 1792-93.


Captains Furneaux, Flinders, Cook and Bligh all anchored in Adventure Bay, which takes its name from Furneaux's ship. The tiny Bligh Museum of Pacific Exploration at Adventure Bay and the Alonnah History Rooms are both open to the public.

There are several cafes on what are effectively two islands joined by a narrow isthmus. Lovers of fine food will be in their element here with a selection of artisan cheeses and wood-fired breads from Bruny Island Cheese, fresh oysters from Get Shucked, wine tastings at Bruny Island Premium Wines, Australia's southernmost vineyard and an extensive selection of Tasmanian single-malt whisky at the Bruny Island House of Whisky.

Check out the Bruny Island Chocolate Factory to sample fudges, truffles, sauces, chocolates, jams and gourmet foods. Or, in summer, try some fresh raspberries from the Bruny Island Raspberry Farm – pick your own if you enjoy working for your supper.

Wildlife on the island includes albino wallabies, nocturnal creatures like quolls and pademelons, a colony of fairy penguins and all manner of birds, from parrots to perky little red breasted creatures. Fur seals inhabit rocky outcrops and can be seen on an adventure cruise.

Also keep an eye out for sea eagles, albatrosses and – during the season – dolphins and whales. There might even be the odd sluggish echidna crossing the road.




